- 1. Title: Times 14, **bold type**
- 2. Author: Times 10
- 3. Abstract: Times 10 single-spaced
- 4. Section header: numbered, Times 12, bold type
- 5. Tables and Figures headers: Times 10, below each table or figure and numbered
- 6. Text: Times 12 & double-spaced
- 7. Length: 6000 words (approx.)
- 8. Margins: The margins should be set at 2.5 cm top and bottom and 2.5 cm right and left.
- 9. Avoid footnotes and endnotes as far as possible
- 10.References should be set out in alphabetical order as follows:
